
Metadata quality

- Date normalisation





Europeana APIs

Four APIs are available, all free to access after a simple registration process.

- → The <u>REST API</u> is the most frequently used API. It enables users to filter records by a variety of <u>data fields</u>, from date and creator, to media type and size.
- → The <u>Europeana Linked Open Data service</u> allows users to explore, access, and download metadata through our <u>SPARQL endpoint</u>.
- → The <u>Europeana OAI-PMH service</u> supports users to harvest the entirety, or a selection of all Europeana metadata.
- → The <u>Europeana Annotations API</u> allows users to generate, update, and retrieve annotations for objects in our collections.

The National and University Library in Zagreb (NUL) started cataloging web resources as early as 1998. The objective is to collect and permanently preserve web resources as part of the Croatian cultural heritage. Resources are selected for archiving according to the criteria set by the National and University Library in Zagreb. The collected resources complement the national collection with content of scientific or cultural significance.




